



ScAIEM and Produktion2030 2023-11-24

Graduate Course "Get your paper published"

This very popular hands-on academic publication course guides participants through the journal writing and publication process with their own contribution. Back for the ninth time in 2024!

Target group

Junior academic researchers (PhD students) with the ambition to publish in major academic journals, to support doctoral studies in the production, innovation and/or industrial engineering and management areas, and, also possible for

Senior researchers with publishing experience and who intend to get their articles published in higher ranked academic journals in these areas.

Context

The course is part of the Graduate School of <u>Produktion2030</u>, a Swedish strategic innovation program. It is also offered within <u>ScAIEM</u>, the Scandinavian Academy of Industrial Engineering and Management.

Content

The course will have three meetings of two days each, and builds on participants' own reading/writing assignments in-between the meetings. The meetings are a mix of face to face and virtual meetings.

Schedule 2024 (preliminary)

15-16 January 2024, Place: Royal Institute of Technology (KTH)

Contents: Course Introduction, Academic Paper Design and Introduction section. Hosts: Professor Matti Kauilo, KTH, Anna Öhrwall Rönnbäck, Luleå University of Technology (IEM field and product/production innovation reasearch).

13-14 May 2024, Place: online

Contents: Continued writing process, theoretical and empirical sections.

28-29 August 2023, Place: online

Contents: Continued writing process, the Conclusion section and Article Readability.

Credits, language and number of participants

7,5 credits. The course is given in English. *Limited number of participants (14 and 2 reserves)*.

Examination

Examination format: Active participation at seminars and fulfillment of duties in between the seminars. The course is passed if the participant by the end of the course has completed a paper ready for submission to an academic journal. However, examination is on the process of writing an academic publication for journal publication and not on the paper itself.

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Grading scale: Pass/Fail.

Learning objectives

At the end of the series of workshops the participant:

- (1) has developed a thorough understanding of the structure of academic papers,
- (2) has trained skills in writing papers for major academic journals,
- (3) has acquired skills to review academic papers, and
- (4) has completed a paper ready for submission to an academic journal.

However, it should be noted that the course learning objectives address *the process* of publishing an academic paper. The paper writing as such is not included in the course credits. The paper writing of an own publication lies outside the course credits and serves as learning materials and an hands-on learning experience during the course.

Requirements

To qualify for the course, the following criteria apply:

- The participant has finished a part of research studies about which a full paper can be written (for PhD students: this is to be decided with their supervisor).
- Before each workshop the participant completes assignments about preparing and/or writing sections of the paper, and peer reviewing another participant's paper.

Trainer

Dr. <u>Eelko Huizingh</u> has been active in academic publishing for over 40 years. He is a prolific author with over 450 publications, including various papers in top level academic journals, and editor of 30+ Special Issues of academic journals. More than 10 of his articles have been cited each 100+ times (Google Scholar). Some of them have even 1,000-2,000 citations (Google Scholar). He is founder and CEO of Huizingh Academic Development, which offers academic writing and academic research workshops, and academic coaching sessions. Dr. Huizingh is affiliated with the University of Groningen (the Netherlands), and is Vice President Scientific Affairs of ISPIM (the International Society for Professional Innovation Management). His ISPIM duties include Head of the Scientific Panel for reviewing conference submissions, and Head of the ISPIM- Innovation Management Dissertation Award Panel. Over the past decades, Dr. Huizingh has given over 150 workshops and seminars on academic writing in more than 25 countries. These events were attended by over 2,500 participants.
